

MAKE SOME NOISE!

How do you describe sounds? Now you've listened to the machines in your home, write or draw them to create a poem or a picture.

Lots of writers do this, with a technique called **onomatopoeia**, where a word sounds like the thing it is describing (e.g. the words 'woof', 'pop' or 'sizzle')

A poem called '*Cynthia In The Snow*' by Gwendoline Brooks does this beautifully to describe snow:

It SHUSHES

It hushes

The loudness in the road.

It flitter-titters,

And laughs away from me.

It laughs a lovely whiteness,

And whitely whirs away,

To be

Some otherwhere,

Still white as milk or shirts

So beautiful it hurts
